## AT JOHN F. KENNEDY (JFK) INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, updated June 28, 2021

The Port Authority continues to strive to meet its commitment to provide opportunities to Minority and Women-Owned Businesses (M/WBEs). Thus, the Port Authority has set an organizational subcontracting goal of 30% M/WBE, with dedications to 20% (MBE) and 10% (WBE) for all contracting opportunities, and utilization of each MBE/WBE racial/ethnic group spread across all contracting opportunities. It is also Port Authority policy to encourage Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business enterprises ("SDVOB") to participate in agency contracts. As such, contractors shall be required to make good-faith efforts to achieve a SDVOB subcontracting goal of 3%.

In addition, the Port Authority also continues to strive to provide opportunities to local businesses. To demonstrate this commitment, the Port Authority continues to emphasize the use of local M/WBE and SDVOB firms, where applicable. In furthering the efforts to achieve this goal and to inform and educate local M/WBE and SDVOB firms of upcoming opportunities, the Port Authority continues to hold focused local outreach and engagement efforts, geared specifically towards informing and educating firms.
